## **Award Winning Producer to Teach History Project Workshop**

**Westminster, Maryland (November 5, 2009)** – Emmy-winning independent producer Leo Eaton will be the special guest teacher for a Carroll County History Project Interview Training Workshop on Saturday, November 21 from 10 am to 2 pm at the Community Media Center. The workshop is free and open to local residents who are interested in collecting memories of the county for the Carroll County History Project. The Carroll County History Project is an initiative to document the history of the county and the memories of its residents. A component of the project, Carroll County Remembers, is a permanent video archive of interviews from those who have memories of the county.

Eaton, who created the format for the oral histories, has been writing, producing and directing for more than 30 years. His work has been featured on many international and U.S. networks, including National Geographic, British Broadcasting Corporation, Public Broadcasting Service and Outdoor Life Network. He served as executive producer on “The Story of India,” which aired in January on PBS and BBC.
